What is Dual Credit?

How It Works

The Dual Credit program allows eligible high school students residing in the ACC Community College District service area to enroll in college level classes.

Students can earn college credit by taking ACC classes on their high school campus, at any ACC campus, or other ACC location. Distance Learning courses are also available. In addition to college credit, students may earn credit toward their high school graduation requirements by completing dual credit courses.

Eligibility

High school students may co-enroll in Austin Community College once they have:

- Successfully completed middle school in either a public school, private school, charter school, or home school.
- Received permission from a parent/guardian and high school counselor and principal
- Passed the appropriate sections of the state approved college readiness assessment (TSI) test administered by ACC or submitted acceptable exemption scores on the ACT, SAT, or EOC test.

Dual Credit Course Options

1. Dual Credit

- Dual credit is earned when students complete college credit courses with acceptable grades, the approval of their high school, and then use these college credit courses to satisfy high school graduation requirements.
- Each school district determines what college credit courses they will accept as dual credit and how they will satisfy high school graduation requirements. It is important to check with your school district for the most current list of approved dual credit courses.

2. Co-enrollment

- A student may enroll in a college credit course and receive only the college credit for that course. Students may take any ACC course for which they meet the academic skills requirements and course pre-requisites. An ACC advisor can help you determine if you meet the requirements for a specific course.

Dual Credit Process for Anderson Students

All paperwork must be completed the semester prior to the class.

- If the student would like to take a dual credit course, put that course on the choice sheet. Please note: this does not enroll the student in the class; he/she must fill out the paperwork and register online.
- Provide verification college readiness via TSI scores or exemption (SAT, ACT, EOC) to the College & Career Center.
- Pick up a "red folder" from the College and Career Center. This folder will have step by step instructions for the application process.

TSI Exemptions:

College Readiness Exemptions:

ACT: Composite 23 and 19 English and 19 Math
Combined CR & M and 500 CR and 500 Math
SAT (new): 480 CR & 530 Math

College Readiness Waivers:

STAAR: English II (combined Reading & Writing test) scaled score of 4000+

STAAR: Algebra I scaled score of 4000+ and (70 or higher) in high school Algebra II
